## Here's how the Symposium works

In each class, experienced instructors show you how to tie the flies listed in the agenda. They also talk about the flies and how they're fished. You then have time to tie the patterns while the instructors offer hands-on, personal advice.

The Beginner's class is an all-day course. Students learn to tie five different flies. For the Beginner's class, the Symposium will lend you the tools you need.

The rest of the program is for experienced tyers. For any of the other classes, you'll need to bring your own tying tools, thread, and head cement. We supply the hooks and materials.

On an all-day pass, you can attend up to four classes. To help you choose, we've rated the classes according to skill level. "E" stands for "Everyone." This means that a basic level of knowledge is all you'll need to learn the patterns. "I" stands for "Intermediate." The flies demonstrated in these sessions are for those with more developed tying skills.

Once you've selected the classes you want, fill out the Registration Form. To avoid disappointment, mark your first and second choice for each time period. **Class size is limited to twenty on a first come, first served basis. Make sure to register early.**

## Your Instructors

### Graham Bristow

Graham was only 13 years old when he started fly fishing for trout on the upper Credit River. That means he has been tying flies and fly fishing for over 25 years. Ten years ago, Graham started guiding professionally. He opened up the Anglers Pro Shop in 2006. Graham now owns A Perfect Drift Guide Company and is one of Ontario's top full time fishing guides. Graham's flies and fly fishing techniques are specialized for Southern Ontario's trout and steelhead rivers. Graham is known as a patient, easy going, skilled instructor and guide. Due to his extensive experience Graham has appeared in many fishing magazines and books and has been a guest speaker at fishing clubs around Ontario and in the US.

### Greg Herring

The current President of Winter Hatches Fly Fishing Club, Greg has been fly fishing and fly tying for almost 30 years. He has led many fly tying sessions and been a featured tyer at a number of venues and shows in Southern Ontario. The purchase of his first true rotary vise 12 years ago impelled Greg into exploring ways of making efficient use of this tool. Greg's sessions will focus on progressively more advanced rotary vise tying techniques. He will demonstrate one trout and one bass fly in each session, reflecting his fishing interests. Greg is also a Federation of Fly Fishers Certified Casting Instructor and a medal winner at the Canadian Casting Championships.

### Ian Colin James

Ian is one of North America's top fly-fishing guides and fly-tying instructors, combining down-to-earth methods with razor-sharp, Scottish wit. For 29 years, Ian's "no bull" approach to fly-fishing has helped folks learn how to cast, find fish and catch the fish they find. Ian was the first guide on the Grand River. He is now the first in Canada to teach an accredited fly-fishing course: at Fanshawe College in London, where, in 2010, he was the recipient of the President's Distinguished Part-Time Teacher Award. Ian's flies are sold worldwide and several of his original patterns are in the Orvis catalogue. His work is also showcased in the prestigious book series "Flytyers of the World," Volume 3.

### Brian Primeau

Brian has been fly fishing since 1988. As co-creator and manager of The First Cast Fly Shop in Guelph, Brian was a full-time guide and instructor for 8 years. He still guides and creates web content for the store. Brian's writing and photography have been featured in Canadian Fly Fisher and Ontario Out-of-Doors magazines. He has also been a demonstrator at Grand Opportunities and has been a guest speaker at many of Ontario's fly fishing clubs for over 10 years. Since 2009, Brian has been fly fishing in Chilean Patagonia. He recently co-established [www.ChileTrout.com](http://www.ChileTrout.com), a partnership that provides guiding, lodging and travel services for Canadian fly anglers wanting to discover Patagonia.

### Mike Verhoef

Mike was born and raised in the heart of Huron County, along the banks of the Bayfield River. At 12 years of age he discovered the thrill of catching fish on a fly – a feeling that has stayed with Mike to this very day. Mike later moved to Alberta, where he lived out some of his fly fishing dreams camping along Rocky Mountain streams that were home to wild cutthroat trout. In 2003, upon moving back to his home waters along Ontario's west coast, Mike started his own guided fly fishing business: Fly Fitters. With 9 seasons of guiding and 3 decades of fly fishing experience, Mike finds great reward in watching people connect with fish on a fly – particularly when it's one of his creations.

### William Gerrard – Beginners Class

William has been tying flies for over 25 years and has chaired the Fly Tying Symposium since 2002. His approach to tying is straightforward: "It's technique and practice, not talent, that make a fly tyer. Anyone can learn how to tie flies." Based on his experience leading fly tying courses for all ages, William has devised a program for beginners that will take the "mystery" out of fly tying. A team of well-qualified Assistant Instructors supports William in the Beginners Class. Together, they'll make sure you get the coaching you need.
